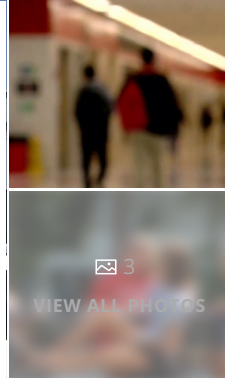

LITTLE ROCK (KATV) — The North Little Rock School Board has approved a pronoun policy for its district employees.

The new policy says that employees should only refer to students by the name listed on their birth certificate and by pronouns consistent with their biological sex.

However, there are exceptions for students who are 18 or older and for students who have written permission from a parent or legal guardian
