MARCHING FOR TRANSRIGHTS

In recent months, we have witnessed a surge in discriminatory bills and horrifying physical attacks targeting transgender individuals. We refuse to stay silent in the face of such hatred and violence. All across our nation, forty-nine states have introduced legislation that would negatively impact transgender individuals rights. From Kentucky, where the state legislature overrode the Governor's veto of an HRT ban, to Florida where SB 254 has granted the state the power to kidnap transgender youth and force adults to submit to genital checks for using a public restroom, to West Virginia where HB2007 has banned access to gender reassignment surgery for adults and to Nebraska where state Senator Machaela Cavanuagh has entered into her third week of filibustering every piece of legislation as protest to anti-trans legislation. And to add insult to injury, the powers that be have begun to punish dissenting opinions, as the Nebraska state Senator Megan Hunt has faced an ethics investigation for voting no on an anti-trans bill; and Montana Representative Zooey Zephyr, an openly transgender lawmaker, was censured and barred from being on the House floor, anteroom and gallery, effectively preventing her from performing her duties. These are not poor decisions, these are not the hard choices, these are acts of genocide, these are crimes against humanity. We should not have to fight for our lives in the Land of the Free. If Congress and the President will not pay attention to a problem that is steadily spreading across the nation, then we must bring the problem to them.

On November 20th, the Transgender Day of Remembrance, at 10am one million trans and non-binary people will walk the streets of DC to the Reflecting Pool and demand Congress passes Federal protections for all trans people.

There is not funding for bail or for protection, there is a risk that extremists will see this as an opportunity to attack and therefore there is risk of great bodily harm or worse. By attending you are agreeing you were informed of this risk and agree not to hold the organizers or their associates liable.
